The forks can be lowered back down to the ground by relying on the tiny handle situated on the tiller. Hydraulic fluid is discharged when the handle is activated. The front wheels are found inside the fork ends mounted on levers. The levers are attached to specific linkages that have their own levers uniting with a cylinder. This design allows the links to pressure the wheels down as the hydraulic jack is raised. Raised vertically above the front wheels, the forks only travel high enough to clear the floor to maintain safety. Usually, pallet jacks have steering wheels located at the front of the machine, while each fork is equipped with a single or double wheel design.
